They give free classes at 408 Merrimack Street during the weekdays and at Lowell high School at night. You need to show your residence in Lowell or surrounding areas. Classes go from September to June. You may still sign up in the middle of the year. At Renaissance Club, I recommend using Aztec software, a tutorial. Sign up for free with Heather G. or Heather S. 
